


- What is learned must be applied.

1. LEARN THE STORY OF THE BIBLE

- There are <u>four component parts</u> of the Old Testament and <u>four component parts</u> of the New Testament.
- The Bible, in 66 books, is laid out in <u>8 sections</u> that give us God's story of history.

OLD TESTAMENT: HOLY BIBLE

- 5 Books of Law (Genesis – Deuteronomy)
- 12 Books of <u>History</u> (Joshua – Esther)
- 5 Books of <u>Poetry</u> (Job – Song of Solomon)
- 17 Books of <u>Prophets</u> (Isaiah – Malachi)

New Testament:

How to Die Faithfully in the Lord (Rev.)


2. LEARN THE GREAT THEMES OF THE BIBLE

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
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
HAPTER 1.

(2 Timothy 4:13 KJV) The cloak that I left at Troas with Carpus, when thou comest, bring with thee, and the books, but especially the parchments.



Suggestions for Selecting Books:

- 1) Build your library around reference books.
- 2) Begin with brotherhood resources and work outward to evangelical resources.
- 3) Balance yourself between classics of old and newer scholarship.
- 4) Read as deeply as possible in order to grow.
