Questions About Angels



Questions About Angels Who is the Angel of the Lord? What about Revelation 20?

Genesis 16:7-12 – Called the "God Who Sees"

Genesis 18-19 — One of the angels was the Lord in the form of man.

Genesis 22 – The angel of the Lord speaks about the blessings from God in the first person.

Genesis 28 – Jacob refers to the one previously identified as Lord as the "Angel of God."

Genesis 32 – Jacob wrestles with an angel, later referred to as God.

Exodus 3 – The burning bush indicates a message from an angel, later referred to as a message from God.

Exodus 13:21 and 14:19 – The first says that the Lord was going before Israel, and the second says it was an angel.

Numbers 22-23 – An angel gave Balaam the words in 22, and in 23 it is the Lord that put those in Balaam's mouth.

Joshua 5:13-15 — This angel accepts worship.

Judges 6 – Gideon uses the phrase "the angel of the Lord" and "the Lord" to describe the same being.

Judges 13 – Seeing the angel of the Lord and seeing the Lord are considered the same thing.

Angel of the Lord

- The Angel of the Lord is differentiated from the Father, yet also accepts worship and is identified as God.
- It seems that the "angel of the Lord" is God the Son, before coming to earth as Jesus.

Angel of the Lord

1 Corinthians 10:2-4 - "and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea; and all ate the same spiritual food; and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they were drinking from a spiritual rock which followed them; and the rock was Christ."

Angel of the Lord

John 8:56-58 – "Your father Abraham" rejoiced to see My day, and he saw it and was glad." So the Jews said to Him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have You seen Abraham?" Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was born, "I am."

Revelation 20

- Revelation is apocalyptic literature, which uses symbolic numbers.
- Revelation 19 reveals that the Roman Empire and Emperor worship would end.
- Satan has always been limited, to some degree.
- Though Satan is "released," verses 7-10 remind us that he is stopped before doing damage.

Revelation 20

- The 1,000 years is not a literal number, and it is not an earthly reign.
- Those reigning are the martyrs mentioned earlier in the book.
- John is saying that Satan will never again be allowed to use a worldwide empire to persecute the church. And God is ultimately in control.

Both of these questions remind us that God is in control.
