The National 911 Program
Celebrates 50 Years of 911

- **Many 911 call centers follow protocols that guide callers through a sequence of questions to quickly obtain information necessary for dispatching the right responders to the right location. Call-takers may also provide instructions about what to do until help arrives. Even though protocols are designed to help call-takers reassure callers and take charge of the situation, **the experience can be stressful for a 911 caller who is not accustomed to dealing with emergencies. When you call 911, be prepared to answer the call-taker's questions, which may include:****



- **When you call 911, be prepared to answer the call-taker's questions, which may include:**
- **The location of the emergency, including the street address**
- **The phone number you are calling from**
- **The nature of the emergency**
- **Details about the emergency, such as a physical description of a person who may have committed a crime, a description of any fire that may be burning...**

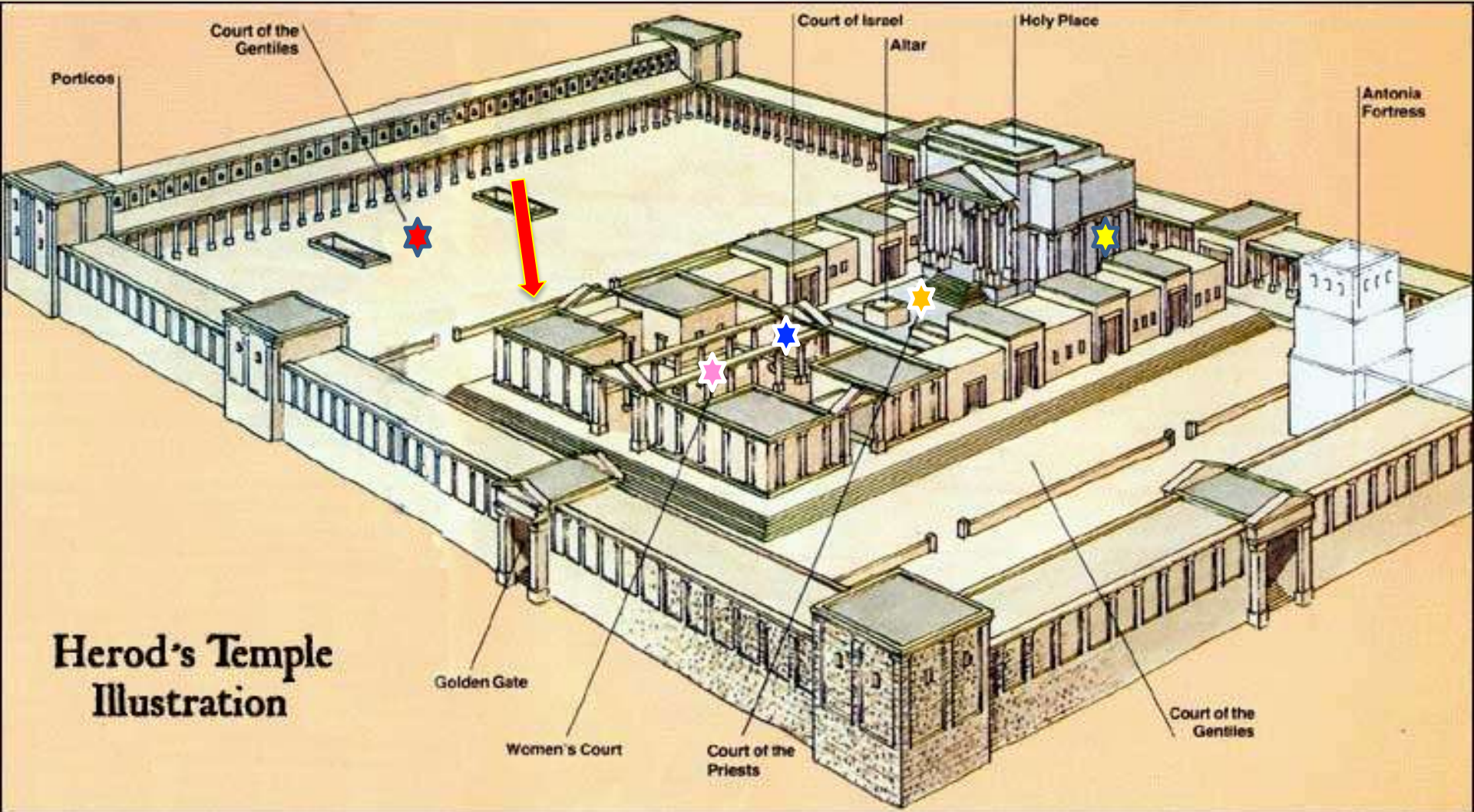



Calling

- Hebrews 5:1-5
- 1 **For every high priest** taken from among men is **appointed** on behalf of men in **things pertaining to God**, in order to offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins; 2 he can deal gently with the ignorant and misguided, since he himself also is beset with weakness; 3 and because of it he is obligated to offer sacrifices for sins, as for the people, so also for himself.

Calling

- Hebrews 5:1-5
- 4 And no one takes the honor to himself, but receives it when he is **called by God**, even as Aaron was. 5 So **also Christ did not glorify Himself** so as to become a high priest, but He who said to Him, "YOU ARE MY SON, TODAY I HAVE BEGOTTEN YOU";

- Hebrews 5:6-10
- 6 just as He says also in another passage, **"YOU ARE A PRIEST FOREVER ACCORDING TO THE ORDER OF MELCHIZEDEK."**
- 7 In the days of His flesh, He offered up both prayers and supplications with loud crying and tears to the One able to save Him from death, and He was heard because of His piety. 8 Although He was a Son, He learned obedience from the things which He suffered. 9 And having been made perfect, He became to all those who obey Him the source of eternal salvation, 10 **being designated by God as a high priest** according to the order of Melchizedek.
