- It did not inform the writer when there was no need (Acts 22:3, 2 Peter 1:16).
- It did not cite only Biblical sources (Acts 17:28, Titus 1:12).
- It did not make writers all-knowing (1 Corinthians 1:16, 2 Corinthians 2:12-13).
- It did not make the writers sinless (Numbers 20:7-13, Galatians 2:11).
- It did not supply the writer with information he could get from other sources (Luke 1:1-4, 1 John 1:1-4).






Wood inv. 4533.10 Wooden mummy tag for a woman named Anoubiaina
